

EXE VALLEY CHALLENGE

EVC Event Sunday June 30th 2019

Training: March - June, Open to all Year 7 students.

Most training is on or after school days, starting in March 2019. Students will walk 10 miles in teams of four.

EXMOOR CHALLENGE

Exmoor Challenge Event Saturday 4th May 2018 on Exmoor - start and finish at Dulverton.

Training is February-May

Who it's open to Year 8 (with a small number of Years 9-11 also selected)

Other relevant info Training days all at weekends except one Friday - high level of commitment required!

EXE VALLEY EXTREME

Monday 15th July 2019

House teams from Years 8-10.

4 teams of four in each year group from each school house makes 48 teams of four in all.

Other relevant info This is a competitive event! Team members will be expected to also be marshals for the main Exe Valley Challenge on June 30th.

JURASSIC COAST CHALLENGE

Friday 21st June 2019

Open to Years 8 (unlimited), 9 and 10 (limited numbers of experienced walkers)

This is a one day, Trust-wide event of 10, 16 or 23 miles in teams of 4 - 6. Teams from Isca Academy, St James, West Exe and Cranbrook will take part in 2019.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD SCHEME

Ongoing - new Bronze groups start in October and new Silvers can start once they are aged 15 if they have finished Bronze. Silver Expeditions start in September 2018 for existing groups.

Open to Years 9-11 no limit on numbers - the more the better! All Year 9 students have D of E on their timetables.
