## Have you got a personal connection to the First World War? Did any of your family fight in that war?

We are asking our students to contribute the personal memories of their own families during WW1, whether they were within our local area then or were in a different part of the country or indeed in a different country.

**Your task:** Collect photographs, letters, and other documentation about these relatives. Such documents would then be translated as a digital resource for use in the live presentation.

**How?** Speak to your parents, grandparents and great-grandparents. What do they know about your family during 1914-1918? Did your great-great grandfather fight in the war? Did your great-great grandmother work in a munitions factory? Ask your family, find any evidence and bring in copies/photographs.
